Our Housing Services provide the support needed for a smooth transition into housing, long-term success in maintaining it, and preventing homelessness or institutionalization. With our expert guidance and personalized services, we are here to empower individuals to live independently and thrive in their communities.

Why We Do What We Do

Reach believes everyone deserves a safe, stable home. Our Housing Services are designed to assist individuals in both transitioning to housing and sustaining their housing long-term. We offer personalized, professional support to ensure that you are not just housed, but able to maintain your independence and quality of life.



Housing Transition

We provide comprehensive support for individuals transitioning into housing, including:

- Developing a personalized housing plan
- Assistance with housing applications and paperwork
- Researching available housing options
- Ensuring adaptive accommodations are in place
- Coordinating moving logistics (lease details, moving supplies, etc.)

Housing Support – Independent

For individuals at risk of homelessness or institutional placement, this service offers:

- Financial assistance with housing costs, including rent, utilities, and necessities
- Coverage of some housing expenses through the Supplemental Security Income or General Assistance programs
- Assistance for individuals 65 or older, or those with a disability impacting their self-sufficiency



Housing Sustaining

Our goal is to ensure individuals stay in their homes successfully. We offer:

- Education and training to build positive relationships with landlords, neighbors, and roommates
- Support in understanding and applying for housing-related benefits
- Assistance with transportation and assistive technology
- Help arranging adaptive housing accommodations
- Guidance in navigating economic assistance programs
- Connection to Community Living Specialist (CLS) staff, especially for those transitioning from group settings to individual living arrangements

Additional Information

Reach provides support for Housing Stabilization Services which include Housing Transitional and Sustaining Services. Reach does not own any housing options; we connect people with community resources.

- To qualify for Housing Stabilization Services:
 - A person may have a current Case Manager who can authorize the service(s) on the Support Plan.
 - If an individual does not have an existing Support Plan, the individual must first take part in the Housing Consultation process. Reach is not able to provide this service as it is a conflict of interest. In addition, the individual will need to obtain proof of eligibility, per DHS.
- Housing Stabilization Services are available to any Medical Assistance recipients over the age of 18.
